Yet, Brexit, divisions over the handling of the financial and refugee crises, and a surge in right-wing populism have cast severe doubt on the ideals and cohesion of the European project. In East Asia, growing economic and societal ties between nations have prompted efforts to promote regional integration, such as the Trilateral Cooperation Secretariat, the Chiang Mai Initiative, or ASEAN+3.
